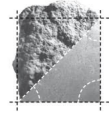

**Redevelopment of existing
building into six storey office
development.**

The project was the redevelopment of the existing site into an office development over 6 floors utilising Portland stone cladding on all elevations.

The architect specified Independent Whitbed for the main cladding element of the building with contrasting Shelly Roach panels on the ground floor and first elevations.

The façade of the building included ornamental features such as ribbed band

courses and vertical columns topped with balls, carved Lion Heads, which were carved in Independent Whitbed by Tim Metcalfe and ornamental balustrades.

Albion Stone supplied approximately 1,000 cubic metres of stone which was fixed on site by Albion Stone Masonry.

The project was Completed in 1989.
